AARR Assessment Tool for Patient Handling



Avoid

Wherever possible, avoiding a hazardous manual handling situation is always preferable.

- · Can the client do the activity independently?
 - Can the operation be automated?
- Can the treatment be brought to the client?

Assess

If avoidance is not possible, making a 'suitable and sufficient' assessment of the hazards is the next step.

Consider the task, load, environment, individual capacity and other factors such as equipment.

REDUCE

By following the risk assessment you are reducing the risk of injury to all persons involved to the lowest level reasonably practicable.

Training and supervision of staff in safer handling techniques, introducing appropriate handling aids and maintaining these in good working order will, among other things, help reduce the risk.

REVIEW

Risk assessments should be reviewed when changes occur or when they are no longer valid.

It should also be reviewed if there is an accident or a case of ill health as a result of a manual handling operation.
